Market Sector	 Commercial
Hazard identified	Unable to locate a person who has inadvertently entered the sea
Potential consequence of hazard	Inability to locate person in sea resulting in either their exposure or drowning
Cause	No automatic distress electronic signal sent when person enters the sea
Outcome	Potential for loss of life or major injury
Recommendation	Provide a device attached to personnel's lifejacket which will automatically transmit an electronic distress signal to Search & Rescue co-ordination resources. Provide personnel with knowledge, understanding and practical training of the device

Solution provided - Sea Marshall® PLB8-LR'SOS' (SMRS-LR'SOS') 121.5MHz with detachable antenna  
One unit was provided to each member of MIRG, covering the whole of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland Coastline, approximately 400 units in total. Date delivered Dec. 2005 and Feb 2006
